## POKETO AT THE LINE HOTEL

Los Angeles

Colorful, witty Poketo brings a dose of delight to the industrial-cool feel of The Line Hotel in L.A.'s Koreatown. Stocked with modern-minimalist housewares, stationery, apothecary goods, and accessories, it's a smaller outpost of Ted Vadakan and Angie Myung's popular Arts District flagship. "The hotel wasn't looking for a cookie-cutter shop with the normal knickknacks, and we would never do that," Ted says.
